MAY 2024 STORM

Homeowners and volunteers who place storm-related debris for collection should keep disaster debris separate from household garbage. Garland Sanitation is working extended hours to remove storm-related debris from public property.



All vehicles in the impacted area should be removed from the streets to allow large debris vehicles access.



Contractors hired by homeowners for repair or demolition are required to remove and dispose of debris.



No hazardous waste will be removed by the City. Contact Dallas County Home Chemical Collection Center at (214) 553-1765.

How You Can Help

Please help by removing all obstructions from your neighborhood street to provide access for large debris removal vehicles. Place items behind the curb and in separate piles (vegetation, construction/demolition debris, appliances, etc.). Do not block travel lanes.

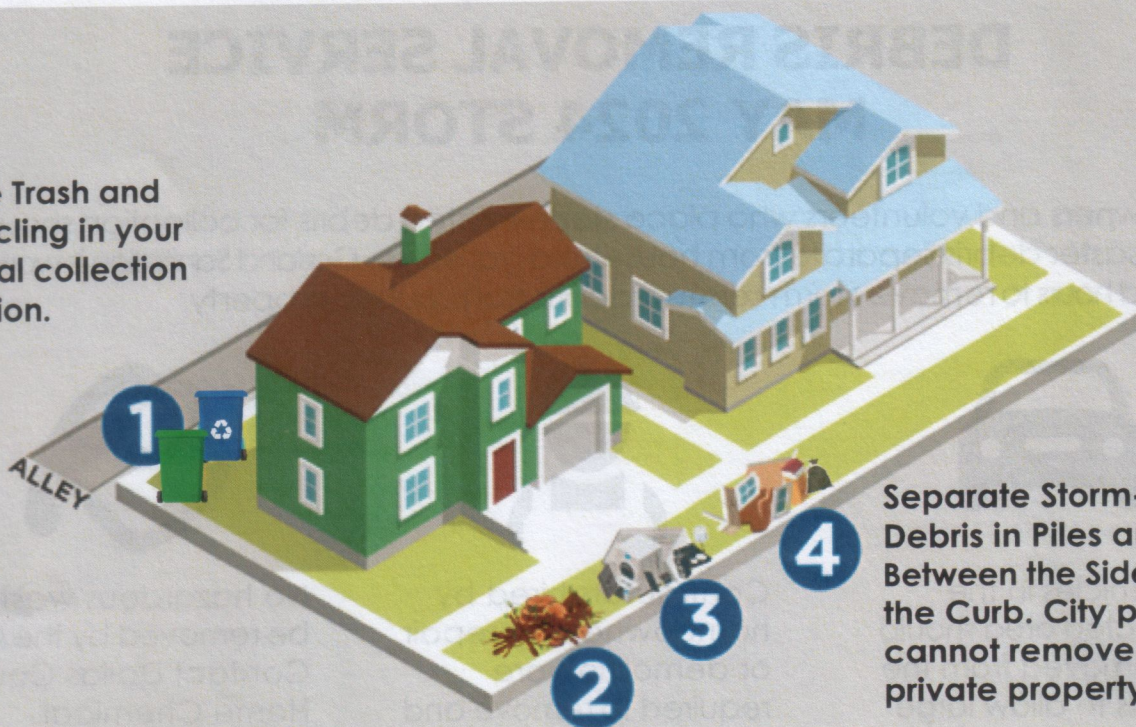
Trash/Recycling Collection

Normal trash and recycling collection services throughout the city are running on schedule. Our Brush and Bulky crews are currently running behind on large pile collections but continue to work extended hours to meet service demands.

Debris Set Out Quick Guide

Place Trash and Recycling in your normal collection location.



Separate Storm-Related Debris in Piles and Place Between the Sidewalk and the Curb. City personnel cannot remove debris on private property.

- 1 Household Garbage and Recycling Carts:** Bag trash, discarded food, packaging, and papers before placing in green cart. Recycling should be clean, dry and loose in recycle cart. All garbage and recycling should be placed at your normal collection point, curb or alley.
- 2 Vegetative Debris:** Please keep Tree branches, and logs in sections no larger than seven feet. Small items like twigs and leaves should be bagged for easy removal.
- 3 White Goods/Appliances:** Refrigerators, dryers, washers, freezers, AC units, stoves, water heaters and dishwashers can be placed on the curb for collection or they can be dropped off at the City's Recycling Center.
- 4 C & D:** Construction debris, building materials, drywall, lumber, carpet, furniture, mattresses, and plumbing materials. Small items should be boxed or bagged together. Tile, rock, and cement cannot be collected curbside and must be taken directly to the Landfill.
