# **District 5 Update**

Hello, Orchard Hills Neighbors!

From council meetings and special events to Build Garland Day and more council meetings, it has proven to be a busy summer. I graduated from the Garland Citizens Police Academy Class #58, and I urge everyone to sign up for the next class. The highlights for me were driving a police vehicle at HBJ and experiencing scenarios night, where I got a mere glimpse of what our brave officers face daily. The Garland Fire Department has a citizen class, too. It's next on the list for me. As we head into much-anticipated cooler weather and the future unveiling of Rick Oden Park sometime in September/October, I hope you will not hesitate to give me a call with your concerns and comments, or just to chat. Here are some local, pertinent updates:



#### FY 2023-24 Operational Budget

It's August, and that means it's budget season! The proposed budget increases staffing and pay for the Garland Fire Department, increases pay for Garland Police Officers, includes additional city staff and city personnel merit increases, and VERBs master plan funding. The tax rate and electric utility rates will decrease. Most importantly, there will be an increase in reserves to counter the looming threat of inflation and economic recession. City Council will have several budget meetings throughout the month of August, and the budget will be finalized on September 5th.

#### **City Council Committees**

I was appointed Chair of the Public Safety Committee, member of the Administrative Services Committee, and alternate for the Dallas Regional Mobility Coalition (DRMC). Committees perform preliminary policy work. It is a true honor to participate in the committee process, and I am excited to serve District 5 in this capacity.

#### **Committee Openings**

City Council has requested a Charter Review and an inquiry into a Bond Program. Staff is collecting applications for appointments to each. The committees will meet weekly for several months to review the City of Garland Charter and a possible Economic Development Bond Program. Both issues will ultimately require voter approval. #### **Downtown Square**

Mark your calendars for October 14th! There will be a huge grand opening with an evening performance by LeAnn Rimes. This is sure to be an awesome celebration and unveiling of the long-awaited Downtown Garland Square renovation!

#### **Left Turn Lanes**

Left turn lanes will be installed on Miller Road at the Glenbrook Drive intersection. Utilities will be relocated, and some new paving is required to allow for the additional lanes. The estimated project completion date is December 2024. I really hope the lanes will ease traffic and deter some of the rampant red-light runners at that intersection, but be aware that construction there is going to be rough.

# Yard of the Season goes to...905 Treasure

Yes, it is hot outside-somewhere between 101 and 107. It is Texas, and it is August.

BUT, there is a way to cool off instantly.

Walk by 905 Treasure. The house is a cool blue with cool white trim, cool green St. Augustine grass, and cool white caladiums. The temperature drops many degrees.

Don't believe me? Go by.

The front yard is a combination of old and new. Two pecan trees are from the pecan orchard heritage. The huge evergreen tree is almost as old. The fence on` the north is a combination of nandina and vines. It is quite restrained from the original vines covering everything when the owner moved in. It is a lovely green.

The garden area to the left of the front door is bordered by white caladiums. At each end is a small yew. There are also three coral berries. The larger garden to the right is also bordered by white caladiums, beginning and ending with low juniper.

Two topiaries sit beside the garage. On each side of the front door are large pots with tall juniper, coleus, and two kinds of ivy. All the pots are white to match the house trim.

Except for the trees and fence hedge, everything is brand new, including the owner. Gary Kidd moved in at the end of August 2022. Yes, he's been here right at a year.

He has done wonders to the front and back yards. He said the backyard had been overgrown with old rose bushes and vines. He did get a few keepers with the backyard: a very tall wood fence, three crape myrtles, and a beautiful blue pool. Then everything else is brand new.











### Yard of the Season continued...

To the left is a small seating area surrounded by Mexican petunia. These are shrubs that look really goodareally cool-looking plant that is white and airy. Along the fence are red geraniums, blooming beautifully.

Along the back of the pool are the crape myrtle, Japanese maples, a bench, and a chimenea. Surrounding the pool are lots of rosemary, lavender, citronella, and other plants that keep mosquitoes away. There are also mounds of purple verbena.

Along the back of the house are white begonias, coreopsis, purple verbena, and several patches of that cool white plant.

All the landscaping has been done this spring. This is an example of what can be done in a short time. Gary gives credit to his friend at Calloway's for helping him select plants and placing them.

Just standing in the front yard, you can get lots of good ideas while you cool off from the summer heat.

This is no joke; 905 Treasure is a real treasure.

# Home Improvement Incentive Rebate for 2023

There are 500 properties in Orchard Hills Neighborhood that meet the qualification of being over 30 years old and appraised below \$250,000. Are you one of them?

The city is offering a 50% cash rebate (up to \$10,000) on approved exterior remodeling. All applications must be approved prior to any work starting. Minimum investment for the program is \$1,000.

#### Items covered:

- Re-shingle roof with 30-year shingles
- Replace windows with energy efficient windows
- Replace exterior doors, including garage door
- Replacement of soffit and fascia

- Replace entire driveway with concrete
- Replace or repair fence
- Install or replace gutters
- Add or repair front porch

# **House Appraisal**

Have you ever wondered what your appraisal of your house would be today if you paid \$100,000 for your house in 1990? (This assumes your house is in the same condition as it was in 1990.)

Here is how to determine that number using the Federal Housing Finance Agency House Price Index (HPI).

- 1. Get the HPI for 1990 (121.73%)
- 2. Get the HPI for 2022 (581.55%)
- 3. Determine the percentage of increase by subtracting: 2022 HPI minus 1990 HPI (581.55% 121.73% = 459.82%)
- 4. Multiply your 1990 house value (\$100,000) by the percentage of increase from item 3 (459.82%)

\$100,000 \* 459.82% = \$459,820

So your house should appraise at around \$459,820 (add or subtract improvements or issues).

Keep in mind this is for the structure and does not include the land.

For this example, the land value was \$20,000 in 1990 and \$45,000 in 2022.

If you are thinking of protesting your appraisal, this is a starting point for determining what your house is worth.




