Garage Sale 2023 Review

Well, another great event has come and gone. Maybe it doesn't compare to the eclipse, but some people wore special glasses to watch it. And maybe the attendance wasn't as high as the State Fair Opening Day, but lots of people stopped to browse, buy treasures, and talk.

Like many other great events, The Orchard Hills Neighborhood Association Annual Garage Sale will not be seen for another year. We are already planning for record attendance in 2024; save the date—September 27 and 28, 2024.

The 2023 sale was year 17. We have had as many as 24 sign up one year and as few as 14 another year. If we try to find an average of 17 per year (17 is a good number for this year...see 17 average for 17th sale), that is 289 garage sales under the OHNA umbrella. (Yes, we know garage sales go on all year without us. How is that possible?)

Each year OHNA gets the permits from code compliance, provides a yard sign, puts signs outside the neighborhood, and advertises through social media. Sometimes the procedure runs very smoothly; sometimes we have a few glitches. (People have been very forgiving and still talk to me.) People have garage sales for two reasons: to clean out the house and to make a little money.

Actually, there is a third important reason: to meet people. This year I met neighbors, people from other parts of Garland, folks from Royce City and Forney, people on their way to and from work or to and from school, and those visiting family.

I did okay meeting people and cleaning some things out of the house. Did I make a fortune? Well, no. I might have if I had sold tools, jewelry, records, vintage clothing, collectors' items, or military memorabilia. As you can tell, my stock was ordinary, some might say uninspiring, insipid, or dull.

But, other people have better stories. Some met people, cleaned out the house, AND made money. Maybe they had interesting, inspiring, and collectible items. In other words, something people really wanted.

Our garage sales also helped other people. Eleven households donated to Arms of Hope, a group that supports three children's homes, provides counseling for families and offers other services in Dallas, Tarrant, Denton, and Medina Counties. Thank you to those generous people.

Thanks to all the people who set up shop, greeted and entertained people. Thanks to the people in the neighborhood who went shopping. Special thanks to Jim Neargarder who made the maps, got the word out, and left town. Special thanks to Margi Bice and her crew who put out and picked up signs.

As you can see, the OHNA garage sale is more than just a sale. It is an event. A neighborhood event. With our own photographer. Thank you, Jan Alexander.

Hello, Orchard Hills neighbors!

Our neighborhood is still one of the safest in the city according to our NPO, Officer Sherry. The biggest issue is cars being broken into. Be sure to lock your car doors and do not leave valuables inside. With the holidays coming up, be more watchful about your surroundings, especially if you have packages scheduled for delivery, and keep an eye on your mail.

When returning from the bank or check-cashing business, be on the lookout for someone following you. There is a scheme called Jugging that is happening to people returning to their next stop and being robbed. If you notice this happening, call the police and go to the police station. Get a description of the car and license plate if possible.

At our last quarterly Crime Watch meeting with the NPOs, the lady from the City of Emergency Preparedness for Garland spoke with us about being ready for any bad weather, extreme hot or cold conditions, flooding, and—God forbid—terrorist attacks. Have an emergency bag with a device able to pick up emergency broadcasts, water, food, a whistle, a flashlight, a charging station for your phone, and a NOAA weather radio. Yard of the Season


Our OHNA Yard of the Season for fall is the lovely home at 825 Carney Drive. Aurelia and William Drake previously lived on Medina in Garland and wanted a yard with a little more sun.

In the side yard they have vitex, irises, lantana, oak leaf hydrangea, yuccas, color guard yucca, cholla cactus, prickly pear, salvia, sedum, petunias, diamond frost euphoria, moss rose, angelonia, nandina, blue daze, sweet potato vine, and gaura.

In the front yard they have ming fern, Thai basil, holly bushes, Japanese holly ferns, ajuga, coleus, celosia, autumn joy sedum, pepper plants, forsythia, pomegranate bush, cannas, yaupon hollies, and lots of pretty pumpkins.

The backyard is so beautiful and interesting. It's a shame it can't all be in the front, too. There is variegated ginger, horsetail reed, rose bush, cosmos, moonflower, milkweed, catmint, assorted cacti, African irises, lamb's ear, indigo bush, begonias, Malabar spinach, spider web aurelia, holly bushes, coral bells, passion flower, pentas, Thai basil, parsley, oregano, various succulents, Mexican petunias, various ferns, thyme, rosemary, chocolate mint, and a pomegranate tree.

The Drakes said they absolutely love this neighborhood, and we're so glad to have them.





District 5 Update • Margaret Lucht

The Holidays are right around the corner. I have a Town Hall this month, and there is also a very important open house for the Saturn Springs Drainage Project.

District 5 Town Hall

November 30th – 6:00 pm to 7:30 pm

South Garland Branch Library, 4845 Broadway Blvd

GPD will address the skatepark and share information about reporting loud music and gunshots. Animal Services will tackle loose dog issues and the state of the shelter. Parking Marshals will talk about parking violations and how to address them. Code Compliance topics will address the STR (Short-Term Rental) ordinance, overcrowded residences, and businesses operating out of homes. I will also give a district update and give an eAssist demonstration.

2019 BOND DRAINAGE PROJECTS OPEN HOUSE

November 28th – 5:00 pm to 6:30 pm

The Atrium, 300 N 5th St

Learn about the three drainage improvement projects in the 2019 Bond Program: Country Club Park Estates, Montclair No.2 and No.3, and Saturn Springs Estates. Share thoughts and ask questions during this come-and-go event. The Saturn Springs Drainage Project is especially important for OHNA residents as it will directly affect the entire neighborhood. I will keep the OHNA board updated as the project progresses.

RICK ODEN PARK PHASE TWO COMPLETE

The whole park is open and ready for the Garland community to enjoy. There are a handful of upgraded and new amenities at the park, including a new playground, shade structure, and a pedestrian bridge. There are benches and water fountains throughout. The park also features new restrooms and walking trails, paving improvements, and a baseball field.

GARLAND'S DOWNTOWN SQUARE GRAND OPENING

The crowd showed up on October 14th as Garland celebrated the long-awaited grand opening of the Downtown Square and the State's dedication of Garland's Bankhead Cultural Arts District. An estimated 10,000+ people attended the Downtown Garland Square Grand Opening! Additional data showed that approximately 45% of Saturday's attendees live outside of Garland and spent an average of 140 minutes on the Square. Seven Garland Mayors and many former Council Members were also there for the festivities. Since the opening, the square has seen many visitors, and downtown businesses have reported increased sales and patrons.


