District 5 Update

Greetings, Orchard Hills Neighbors!

In the wake of the May 28 storm, we have come together as a family, stronger and more united than ever. Though these times have been challenging, it is heartwarming to witness the resilience and spirit that define our city. Seeing neighbors come together to help each other clear debris and fallen trees, share homes and generators with those who had no power, and donate food and water has been truly inspiring. Your acts of kindness and cooperation demonstrate the strength and unity of our community. Together, we have overcome hardships and emerged even more resilient. Let us continue to support each other and extend a helping hand wherever needed. This is our city, our Garland, and I am so proud to be part of it.



District 5 Town Hall

Our next District 5 Town Hall meeting will be August 29, 2024, at 6:00pm at the South Garland Branch Library. There will be presentations from the Sanitation Department and GP&L. I will also provide a District 5 update and instructions for residents affected by the Montclair Drainage Project. Regarding the Saturn Springs Drainage Project, residents will have an opportunity to meet one-on-one with staff once the plans are at 60%.

2024 Garland Community Survey

The results are in! We had 7% participation rate from randomly selected households and 1,193 responses from open participation. Here are the priorities set by survey participants:

- 1) Utilities
- 2) Safety
- 3) Economy
- 4) Mobility
- 5) Education, Arts, and 8) Parks and Culture
- 7) Community Design
- Recreation
- 6) Health and Wellness 9) Natural Environment
- **10)** Inclusivity and Engagement

FY 2024-25 Budget

Council members attended a pre-budget workshop on July 27. The discussion focused on major cost drivers for personnel, operational costs, and long-term funding initiatives for retiree COLA. Economic development, a future bond program, streets, drainage, and facilities improvements were also discussed. There is no proposed tax rate increase; however, there are proposed utility rate adjustments (based on a typical residential user):

- Electric Utility Rates: No increase
- Water Utility Rates: Expected 2.6% increase (\$1.66)
- Wastewater Utility Rates: Expected 3.5% increase (\$1.16)
- Sanitation Residential Rates: To be determined
- Stormwater Residential Rates: Expected 12.8% increase (\$0.65)

I encourage you to participate in the upcoming public hearings to provide input on the proposed budget:

- August 5: Presentation of the proposed budget.
- August 17: Special session for departmental presentations and discussions.
- August 19: Regular session for council discussion.
- August 20 & 27: Public hearings on the proposed budget and tax rate.
- September 3: Final overview, public hearing, and scheduled adoption of the budget and tax rate.



District 5 Update (continued)

Sanitation Update

Residential curbside trash and recycling services are operating on schedule and without interruption. However, following the increased workload from the May storm, the City's Sanitation team is currently behind on large brush and bulky item pickups. Despite this, they remain dedicated to residential curbside debris collection and have identified additional utility easements in need of debris removal. The Sanitation team is working extended hours and will continue until all routes are up to date. So far, over 24,398 tons (48,796,000 pounds) of storm debris have been collected. Yard of the Season goes to...1309 Dale Drive

Giovanni Oviedo decided to purchase in this neighborhood in 2018 for the size of the lot. He is a small business owner and needed space to accommodate equipment. In the past few years, the Oviedo family has worked tirelessly to transform what was once a small wood frame house into this brick beauty accented with white stone. This hidden gem, located at 1309 Dale Drive in the heart of the Orchard Hills Neighborhood, is Yard of the Season.

One could easily spend quite a bit of time sitting on the Oviedo front porch in one of their comfy rockers enjoying the calming display of colors from the petunias with the occasional bursts of yellow, red, and orange from the Pampas Plumes Cockscomb that fill each of the three flower beds extending from porch to sidewalk. Rose bushes grace the front of the home along with a couple of big rocks he brought home from Wisconsin. Whimsical characters of frogs and turtles dot the lawn. In a place of honor by the entrance, a plaque declares the family name and date established.

Proudly demonstrating his new irrigation system—controllable from his smartphone—Giovanni has installed a lawn sprinkler and an individual drip at each tree and planter to ensure proper watering.

There is fencing around the back of the property to provide privacy and security and act as a buffer for the occasional family celebration.

This magnificent display is a delight to any neighborhood walker such as me. Giovanni's daughter shared that delivery men regularly comment how they slow down when approaching their home to take in the beauty on display and check to see what has been added.

Giovanni faithfully continues his part to Keep Garland Beautiful having recently added a few peach trees along the parkway. As of this writing, an Ash tree, a Fig, and some Begonias stand ready for the planting.



I have consented to become a candidate for the office of councilman for the City of Garland at the insistence of numerous of my friend who had a petition out for me before I was aware of it. Their faith in my qualifications to serve them I consider an honor. I have live in this community all of my life. My experience has been in the government field most of my life. If I am elected to the City Council, I believe the first thing I would do would be to look at the salaries of the bosses, sub-bosses, assistant bosses and the assistant-assistant bosses, then I would see if each had a secretary and had a car or pick-up furnished and the necessity. I know who is producing, if the majority of the Council would vote with me, we would inform the City Manager that he would have to get along without the others. We do not believe the people who are actually doing the work are being paid enough. I also know that some of the highly paid employees are not worth what they are getting. I also advocate hiring local labor.

We've got thousands of dollars worth of machinery sitting idle and rusting out that we could be using to fix our streets and install our water and sewer mains cheaper than they are doing it now, and we could keep a labor force that would be experienced as we grow. If we are not going to use that equipment, let's sell it and widen some bridges we need, buy future park sites, and put some sidewalks where our school children have to travel.

We are never going to lower city taxes (and they cost everybody extra dollars every month) unless we cut out some overhead. We are a city of 28,000 people set up on a basis of a city of 125,000 people. We can't afford that.

We need more co-operation with out State Highway Department and our County Road system. Our County Commissioner of a court order passed whereby he would help us take care of 10 of our major streets. With a little more co-operation, part of our county tax dollars would be coming back to us instead of going somewhere else, and our city tax dollars correspondingly less.

We need adequate personnel to run the new light plant if it is to be operated profitably. That plant should enable Garland to have things that other cities don't have without having to use tax money for them.

If it is the wishes of the majority of the taxpayers of Garland that the City Council, Plan Commission, or zoning board be expanded, I am for it.

If elected my policy would be for the City Manager to run the city, but the City Council wouldn't be looked upon as a board of directors with the City Manager making most of the decisions as has been the case in the past. I can assure you that all problems concerning the City will get my careful consideration and I will not go along just to get along if it looks like a bad decision for the city






