District 5 Update

Happy Holidays, OHNA!

It has been busy these last few months. I completed the Citizens Fire Academy with the Garland Fire Department and am now a proud member of the Citizens Firefighters Club of Garland. City Council finalized the Operational Budget and will be moving into the Capital Improvement Program (CIP) Beginning in January and finalizing on February 6th, 2025. In the meantime, Council is focused on creating a new Comprehensive Plan and finalizing the Economic Development Bond. The Comprehensive Plan sets forth our vision for the next decade. It determines how tax dollars are spent and how zoning decisions are



made. Your input is invaluable to this process. Please visit GarlandForward.com for more information. The Economic Development Bond Committee has been working hard to determine the parameters of the Economic Development Bond that will be on the May 2025 ballot. Funds for esthetic improvements, land acquisition, corridors, and gateways will be the focus of the bond. City Council will finalize the bond proposition this December.

Miller/Glenbrook Construction

This project has been challenging, to say the least. Scheduled completion is March 2025. Thankfully, when it is over, there will be dedicated left turn lanes on Miller for access to Glenbrook.

Saturn Springs Drainage Project

Three streets were added to the project and that has delayed the 60% project completion date. Once the construction plans hit 60%, residents will be able to set up one-on-one meetings with the Project Management Office. I will notify OHNA and post on social media when the time comes.

Tribute to the Agave

Seven years ago, three Agave Americana, also known as century plant, were installed at Roberts Rest Stop garden. They grew up to be magnificent show-stoppers at the corner of Glenbrook and Briarwood. At Christmastime, they were adorned with colorful ornaments for the enjoyment of all.

And then, in early April 2024, something magical began to happen. One of the agave produced a spectacular, towering stalk that quickly grew to 28 feet tall. Next to appear were over 60 flower clusters, abuzz with bees and hummingbirds reveling in the abundance of nectar. Residents and passersby alike were in awe of this grand display of nature. Children and grownups were curious and asked: What is this plant? What is happening? Can I have some seeds? They were witness to an event that took 10 - 40 years in the making.

When the devastating storm of May 28th came through Garland and destroyed many large trees, the agave bloom stood unscathed. It was a reminder to our neighborhood to take heart, that we are strong survivors.

The blooming of an agave plant is a beautiful but sad event often referred to as a "death bloom" or "doom bloom". The flower stalks can grow impressively tall, and the sweet nectar of the flowers attracts all sorts of pollinators. The blooms then turn into seedpods which are clones of the mother plant. When the mother plant can no longer support its towering stalk, it topples over, propelling the seeds or offspring to the ground. The agave dies after blooming because it has dedicated all its energy to producing the blooms and then the seeds.

As summer wore on, the life cycle of our agave came to an end. On August 14 the fallen and spent agave was ceremoniously removed to make way for new plantings. Seeds were shared with folks hoping to grow a spectacular agave of their own.

Neighborhood Vitality Matching Grant

The City of Garland is offering a 50% cash rebate (up to \$10,000) on approved exterior remodeling of single family detached homes. All applications must be approved PRIOR to any work being started.

Application window opens January 14, 2025

Eligible exterior repairs include, but are not limited to:

- Windows
- Roofing
- Fences
- Exterior Painting
- And More (see program policy for all eligible repairs)

To be eligible for this program, applicants and homes must meet the following criteria:

- Single family house within Garland city limits
- The total appraised value of the property according to DCAD cannot exceed \$300,000
- The dwelling must be at least 30 years old (506 Housed qualify in our neighborhood)
- The dwelling cannot be a mobile home, duplex, or townhome
- If dwelling is a rental property, the owner must be registered with Code Compliance as an active participant in the Landlord Certification Training program
- Applicant must be current on all payments for property taxes and utilities
- No work prior to application approval will be considered

Applications will be available on January 14, 2025

A Bit of History

Garland Residents are no strangers to insurance rate increases.

On November 30, 1889, a fire in downtown Garland destroyed several buildings. Due to the fire, businesses faced high insurance rates. These rates could be reduced if a reliable water system was available for firefighting. However, the volunteer fire department in Garland lacked adequate equipment to handle large fires, and the city had millions of dollars in cotton that required insurance.

To address these issues, a \$100,000 bond issue was approved to construct an underground and above-ground storage tank capable of holding 150,000 gallons of water. This water supply would serve the fire department and some residents. Electricity for the water pumps was to be provided by Texas Power and Light, and a 75-horsepower generator was acquired to ensure a backup power source in case of an outage, meeting the insurance companies' requirements to lower rates. A 2,300-foot well was drilled to supply water to the storage tanks, and a 75-horsepower pump was installed. However, Texas Power and Light would not offer a commercial rate for running the pump, and a residential rate would have cost \$800 per month for continuous operation, which the city could not afford.

With most of the bond money already spent on constructing the system but no funds available to operate it, 20 local businessmen contributed \$1,000 each to finance a power company to run the pump. On April 1, 1923, Garland Power and Light successfully brought a 115 kW generator online.*

How to decrease your insurance costs with some insurance companies:

- avoid high-risk additions (swimming pool, playground set, trampoline)
- boost your credit score for new business
- bundle car and home insurance
- look for discounts
 - residence with no smokers
 - home is less than 5 years old
 - pay premium upfront (usually new policies)
 - paperless billing
 - sign up for automatic payments
 - retiree
 - central alarm system online that reports to your local police department
 - loyalty levels (ie. 9+ years, 20+ years)
- improve your home security
- increase your deductible
- make home improvements
 - Class 4 roof (impact-resistant)
 - shatterproof glass and storm shutters
 - update old electrical, HVAC, or plumbing
 - install a fire sprinkler system
- rethink small claims
 - claims can raise premium by 20% and remain high for up to 5 years following a claim
 - have an estimate done prior to filing a claim with the insurance company; if the estimate is lower than the deductible, then do not file a claim.











Where is Leo the lion today?






