Election Results

2025 Bond Propositions

All bond propositions passed in the May 3rd election, with significant funding earmarked for South Garland. Proposition A focuses on citywide improvements to residential streets, alleys, gateways, and corridors. Proposition B allocates \$75 million for economic development, targeting South Garland, the Medical District, and Harbor Point, including development incentives, land assembly, and revitalization efforts. Proposition C funds renovations to the Granville Arts Center, while Proposition D directs resources to the underutilized Harbor Point area, capitalizing on the potential of the lakefront coastline.

Mayoral Race

Runoff Election Day June 7 | Early Voting May 27 – June 3

Folks, we have a runoff! Council Member Dylan Hedrick is facing off against former Council Member Deborah Morris for Garland's Mayoral seat. Both candidates have websites and contact information available. I encourage you to research both and reach out to them directly. Mayor Scott LeMay has truly left big shoes to fill. He has been an outstanding leader, and it has been an absolute pleasure to serve alongside him.

Projects Around the Neighborhood

Miller/Glenbrook/Saturn

This project is expected to be fully completed by mid-June. The sewer line and main water tie-ins along Miller are finished, along with most of the paving. The final portion of the project involves the Saturn Rd water line and will require multiple concrete pours over several weeks to complete. While it has been a difficult process to endure, we now have dedicated left-turn lanes at Glenbrook and Miller, which has already improved traffic flow and reduced red-light runners.

CIP Projects and Expected Completion Dates

- Jon Comer Skatepark Fencing: Q2 2025
- Rick Oden Splash Pad: Q2 2026
- Jack Coleman Tennis Courts Conversion to Pickleball Courts: Q4 2026
- Saturn Springs Estates Drainage Improvements: Q1 2029. Please note that the design has not yet reached 60%. Once it does, residents will be able to schedule one-on-one meetings with staff.

Typically blooming after 10 to 15 years, the **whale's tongue agave** sends up a massive flower spike that can reach heights of 14 to 20 feet. This bloom is the plant's final act, as it invests all its energy into flowering and seed production before dying—a process characteristic of monocarpic plants, which flower once and then perish.

Observe the final act at both the NE corner of Glenbrook and Briarwood and at Treasure Island.

A Bit of History RICK ODEN PARK

Who Are the Odens — And Why Is There a Park Named After Rick Oden?

The Oden family's story is deeply woven into the history of Garland—a story of community, tragedy, resilience, and service.

The Oden family's journey to Garland began in 1945 when Jack and June Oden moved here from Oklahoma City. Jack, a seismic interpreter with Magnolia Petroleum Company (now part of ExxonMobil), relocated often for work. After years of transfers, the Odens finally planted roots in Garland when Jack was assigned to the company's Dallas headquarters in the early 1950s,

meaning—at least temporarily—an end to the constant moving.


Rick Oden, their son, was born on January 5, 1945. A bright, athletic boy, he quickly became a part of Garland's budding Little League baseball scene. Rick started playing Little League in 1952 at the age of seven, the year after Garland's Little League was founded. He became a standout first baseman for the Temco team, showcasing both skill and passion for the sport.

But on a hot summer night, June 29, 1956, at Cole Park (near Miller Road), tragedy struck. During a Little League game between Temco and Garland Shopping Center, Rick was at bat when he was hit by a pitched ball on the back of his neck, just below his helmet. Despite immediate medical attention and hospitalization, Rick succumbed to his injuries two days later, on July 1, 1956. He was only 11 years old.

Rick's passing sent shockwaves through Garland and beyond. It was believed to be the first death of a Little League player in the United States due to an on-field injury. The community rallied around the Odens, mourning a vibrant young life cut tragically short.

In honor of Rick's memory, the City of Garland renamed Cole Park to **Rick Oden Park** a year after the accident. On July 19, 1957, a heartfelt ceremony was held where Jack and June Oden accepted a plaque memorializing their son. Jim Osborn, then baseball commissioner of Garland Little League, noted, "Rick Oden Field is a living memorial for a boy who loved baseball; it's a name all of us are proud of."

Rick Oden Park eventually grew into one of Garland's largest and most beloved parks. Today, it spans nearly 37 acres, offering a baseball field, a playground, picnic areas, and the Jack Coleman Tennis Center. Thanks to the 2019 Bond Program, the park is undergoing major upgrades, including a new regional playground, a skatepark, and significant infrastructure improvements.

The Odens' story didn't end with Rick's death. Life carried them on a winding path—after Garland, the family moved to Oklahoma City, then Casper, Wyoming, and finally Shreveport, Louisiana, where Jack passed away in 1967 from a brain tumor.

June Oden, a dedicated nurse, returned to Garland, resumed work with the Garland Independent School District, and later answered a different kind of calling: at the age of 59, she joined the Peace Corps, serving in Colombia and Liberia. She remarried later in life and moved to Tulsa, but after her second husband's passing, she came back home to Garland, where she remained active in her church and community until her death in 2006.



A stained-glass window at Garland's First United Methodist Church memorializes Rick Oden, depicting "Let the Little Children Come." Both Jack and Rick Oden are buried at Restland Cemetery, marking a resting place for a family whose history is forever intertwined with the story of Garland itself.

John Oden, Rick's younger brother, carried forward the family's legacy of service and excellence. He graduated from Louisiana State University and earned an advanced degree at Duke University. John pursued a career in hospital administration, managing the construction of major medical facilities across California in cities like San Diego, Los Angeles, and Ventura. Now retired, John lives in Altadena, California, with his husband, Mark. Their home narrowly survived the devastating Eaton Canyon wildfire—another testament to the Oden family's enduring resilience.



Today, Rick Oden Park remains a vital part of Garland, a living tribute to Rick, June, Jack, and John—a family whose story continues to inspire.























