# **District 5 Update**

#### In Case You Missed It: July 31 District 5 Town Hall Highlights

#### **Gateways and Corridors**

More art, please! Garland is reimagining its gateways with colorful, creative signage and public art that reflect the city's personality and history. District 5 corridors will be improved with new landscaping, pedestrian-friendly crosswalks, and planned gateway signage. Traffic boxes will be transformed with unique wraps. Implementation will unfold over several years, guided by the Garland Forward Plan.









#### **Development Updates**

505 W Centerville: A long-blighted site, demolition began but has stopped due to asbestos abatement issues. Demo will resume after clearance from the EPA.

3034 S First St: Renovations are underway to convert the former CVS into a non-ambulatory medical clinic.



# District 5 Update (continued)

#### **Legislative Update**

Senate Bill 840 passed during the 89th Texas Legislature and takes effect on September 1, 2025. It amends the Texas Local Government Code to require cities to allow mixed-use and multifamily housing on commercial properties without holding public hearings or going through a zoning change process.

#### Key points:

- Cities must approve qualifying developments administratively if they meet local regulations consistent with the new law.
- Discretionary approvals like rezoning, variances, or special use permits are prohibited for these projects.
- Conversions of commercial buildings to residential use cannot be subject to additional traffic studies, impact fees, or infrastructure upgrades beyond minimum requirements.
- Districts with heavy industrial uses are exempt.

#### Concerns for Garland:

- Increased strain on aging infrastructure.
- Reduced control over land use and neighborhood character.
- Risk of losing key commercial properties that provide jobs, services, and tax revenue.

In short, SB 840 limits a city's authority to regulate where and how multifamily housing can be built, especially when it replaces existing commercial spaces.

#### **Code Enforcement**

The City of Garland's new Code Compliance Director, Brian Morris, has introduced several new initiatives to improve residential and commercial property conditions. His leadership includes innovative programs and pilot efforts aimed at increasing compliance and responsiveness across the city.

Code enforces a wide range of issues, including overgrown grass, junk vehicles, trash and debris, substandard structures, illegal dumping, and violations at rental properties. In the first half of 2025, the department processed over 2,900 complaints, removed more than 5,000 illegal signs, and cleared 66,000 pounds of urban blight.

In District 5, several properties have undergone significant cleanups. Properties on Ridgedale Drive and Sussex Drive were abated to remove hazardous debris and unpermitted structures. The Code Cares initiative continues to support neighbors in need through community cleanups and volunteer-led beautification projects.

A new weekend pilot program targets illegal street vending. Every Saturday, inspectors patrol known hotspots and issue immediate citations to unpermitted vendors. The effort emphasizes safety, consistency, and neighborhood integrity. Officers are trained in de-escalation and are supported by the Garland Police Department and Health Department when needed.

Several residents had the opportunity to speak directly with Mr. Morris at the town hall and share concerns or ask questions about ongoing code efforts in the neighborhood.

#### **Police**



#### Libraries

The newly renovated Central Library is now open and offers a wide variety of resources, services, and technology for residents of all ages. This \$18 million project included a complete overhaul of the 50-year-old facility, with major infrastructure upgrades like energy-efficient lighting, new fire suppression systems, security cameras, and updated wiring to support expanded digital services. Inside, visitors will find:

- A small business incubator with resources and partnerships to support local entrepreneurs
- A makerspace with 3D printers, crafting equipment, and other tools available to library cardholders
- A recording studio with professional audio and video equipment for public use
- Study pods, conference rooms, and flexible meeting areas with modern technology
- A teen area designed with modular furniture, audiovisual tools, and a dedicated study room
- A full children's floor with hands-on learning materials, child-friendly shelving, and a dedicated activity room for programming

#### Yard of the Season - 2808 Old Orchard Rd.

The 2025 Summer Yard of the Season recipient is 2808 Old Orchard, the home of Baltazar and Maria Torres. Baltazar and Maria moved their four small children to Orchard Hills 22 years ago. They chose this home because they liked the neighborhood and thought it would be a good place to raise their children. Mr. Torres adds that they are one of the first Spanish-speaking families to move into Orchard Hills.

Baltazar is Chef at the Fairmont Hotel, where he has enjoyed expressing his culinary creations for 33 years. He proudly notes that he has served as many as 1,400 meals in a single event. While cooking is his vocation, his hobby is his yard.

One of his first plantings was the oak now fully grown and accented with a bed of colorful impatiens. Yellow cannas line the walkway to the front door, where a wreath graciously welcomes visitors to the home of the Family T. Pots filled with hydrangeas, daisies, dahlias, boxwood roses, sweet pea vines, pink roses, yellow and white daylilies, Justicia Pilossella (known as false honeysuckle), white geraniums, and elephant ears line the walkway across the full length of the front of the home. As a border plant, Baltazar chose the Lemon Lily Gardenia, a trumpet-shaped flower that lasts only one day.

The nostalgic touch of a wheelbarrow holds a fresh herb garden. And, since a chef can never have enough herbs, more pots filled with mint, rosemary, thyme, and parsley are placed throughout the yard.

The family discovered a conch shell when they first moved into their new home and decided it would be a fun addition to their lawn décor. Now the shell is prominently displayed for all to enjoy. Their daughter, Melissa, still puts the shell to her ear to hear the sea. The teal bench is a recent addition that adds a splash of color and provides an inviting seat to simply sit and watch passersby.

As you walk past the front of the home, you can glimpse the backyard, where the family planted avocado and fig trees. If you look closely, you will see a quaint cactus garden.

Whether passing by along Old Orchard or heading up or down Treasure, this little gem of a lawn is a treasure in its own right, providing a lovely display of plants and trees no matter the direction of view.

#### Feline Parvovirus

Feline Parvovirus has been reported in Orchard Hills. This virus is passed in feces, urine, and nasal secretions by cats who have the disease. The virus can contaminate cages, bedding, dishes, and the hands and clothes of handlers. Fleas from other infected cats can also infect a healthy cat. The virus can survive in the environment for months, so a cat can become infected without any direct contact with a diseased cat. No medicines can kill this virus. Kittens have high mortality rates with this virus. Older cats have a better chance of surviving. Good supportive care with intravenous fluids, nutrients, and antibiotics to prevent secondary bacterial infection may help an infected cat survive.

The most effective way of protecting your cat is by vaccination. Your veterinarian will usually advise you to start vaccination at the age of 8 or 9 weeks. Veterinarians recommend two or three doses three to four weeks apart. The last dose should not be before the age of 16 weeks. A follow-up dose at 26 to 52 weeks is also recommended. Since adult cats can also get the feline parvovirus, you must remember to give the booster doses of the vaccine regularly.

While the virus does not always cause symptoms, usual symptoms include:

- Lethargy and depression
- Frothing at the mouth or vomiting
- Watery discharge from the nose
- Fever in the early stages, followed by a low body temperature
- Diarrhea, which may be watery or bloody
- Decreased appetite

If one of your cats has a feline parvovirus infection, they must be isolated from other cats. Their litter box must be cleaned and disinfected regularly. The feline parvovirus can survive in the environment for many months, so you must disinfect your entire home to keep your other pets safe. If your other cats are not vaccinated, they are at a high risk.






