District 5 Update

Hello, Orchard Hills!

From neighborhood improvements to citywide initiatives, Garland continues to make steady progress toward improving access, safety, and quality of life for all residents. We are fortunate to have an incredible team of city staff who keep everything running behind the scenes. Every day, we drive on streets, turn on lights, and enjoy amenities made possible by their dedication. Their work allows us to live our best lives, and I am consistently humbled by their commitment and tenacity.

I want to thank the Orchard Hills Board of Directors and volunteers for their tireless efforts to bring the neighborhood together through the block party, the beautiful lawn flags that honor our veterans and country, and the maintenance of the gardens that so perfectly enhance our

community. It is because of them and all who dedicate their time to Garland that this is a place where we can live our best lives.



DISTRICT 5 AND ORCHARD HILLS UPDATES Tax Rate Swap

In November 2026, the City of Garland will ask voters to consider a tax rate swap designed to address long-term funding needs without increasing the overall tax rate. The proposal would shift a portion of the tax rate from debt service to operations and maintenance, providing greater flexibility in how the city maintains and repairs streets.

The current tax rate remains at 0.6897. Under state law, operations and maintenance are capped at a 3.5 percent annual increase, while debt service is not capped. This creates a challenge when balancing the need for new projects with the ongoing maintenance of existing infrastructure.

The tax rate swap would not change the total amount paid by residents but would create a more sustainable funding model for critical infrastructure and street maintenance over time.



Saturn Springs Drainage Improvements

Project design is currently at 60% completion. The city held one-on-one, in-person meetings with interested property owners on September 30 and October 2 to review the proposed plans and gather feedback. The City expects to bid the project by October 2026, with construction beginning in February or March 2027. These improvements are part of Garland's 2019 Bond Program and are among the last few projects to close out the program.

Parks and Recreation

Staff

Garland's Parks and Recreation Department continues to expand with experienced leadership. Kari Pacheco, Parks Operations Director, brings more than twenty years of experience in municipal parks management. She began her career in aquatics with the City of Plano and has held leadership roles in Garland, Rowlett, and Sunnyvale. Albert Montero, Recreation Director, is a United States Marine Corps veteran with more than two decades of experience in community engagement and recreation, including fifteen years with the YMCA.

Senior Center

Construction is underway, and the new center is expected to open in September 2026. The facility is being built on the same site as the previous center, with the new entrance located on Avenue B. The building will be significantly larger and better-designed to serve the needs of Garland's senior community.

Exterior amenities include a drop-off area, ADA parking, bus parking, a landscaped courtyard, and pickleball courts. Interior features will include a large multipurpose room, classrooms, a library, an immersive experience room, arts and crafts spaces, and a gym with an indoor walking loop.



Rick Oden Park

Splash Pad

Rick Oden Park will soon include an 8,500-square-foot splash pad. The project budget is \$3,092,000, and it is currently in the design and funding evaluation phase.



Jon Comer Skate Park

To address security concerns, the Jon Comer Skate Park fence installation has been completed. Final finish-out items have been completed by the contractor, and new signage is in design and fabrication. Security cameras are scheduled to be installed by the end of the year.

MD Health Pathways

Garland residents will soon have a new option for basic healthcare through a partnership with Tap Telehealth. MD Health Pathways was developed by Dr. Dirk Perritt, a North Texas emergency physician who spent more than ten years in the ER at the former Baylor Medical Center in Garland and continues to practice in Dallas.

Tap Telehealth provides an affordable way for families to reach medical professionals quickly and to receive care when they need it. This partnership was created to expand healthcare access, as nearly 40 percent of Garland residents are uninsured or underinsured.

The service is scheduled to launch in late spring or early summer 2026 and will appear as a separate line item on residents' City of Garland water bills. The monthly fee will begin at six dollars for the first two years, increase by one dollar per year in the following years, and remain capped at nine dollars. The fee covers up to ten people per household, regardless of insurance coverage, age, or participation in Medicare or Medicaid.

Residents can text, call, or video chat with a North Texas-based doctor, physician assistant, or nurse practitioner in minutes. Prescriptions can be sent directly to local pharmacies, and there are no copays or insurance requirements. Tap Telehealth is not intended for emergencies but is well-suited for common illnesses, minor injuries, prescription renewals, and general health questions.

Participation is optional. Residents can opt out at any time by calling <u>972-688-6330</u> or emailing <u>optout@garlandtx.gov</u> with their name, address, phone number, and utility account number, if available.

Before the launch, Garland households can try the service free through a pilot program available to the first 10,000 families who sign up. The pilot operates daily from 8 a.m. to 10 p.m., including weekends and holidays. All Abilities Committee

City Council has established the All Abilities Committee to advance inclusion and accessibility across Garland. The committee will evaluate existing conditions, identify barriers, and recommend practical steps to ensure city programs and services meet the needs of every resident. Applications will be accepted from November 12 through December 3 on the City of Garland <u>website</u>. After the application period closes, Councilmembers will review applicants and make their selections by December 16. Appointments will be presented for approval at the January 6 Council meeting. The Committee represents an important step toward ensuring Garland remains a welcoming and supportive community for residents of all abilities.

Yard of the Season - 806 Blossom


Our Yard of the Season recognition for Fall 2025 goes to the home of Susan and Frank Thompson at 806 Blossom. Susan grew up in this house from the age of 6 years old. Later, when her parents decided to sell the house, she and Frank purchased it. Together, they have raised their two airls and have lived here for 39 years.

Susan has only been gardening the past three or four years. The yard has beautiful, thick grass with a large crape myrtle and a young red oak. The front of the house is lined in boxwoods and nandinas. Blooming in the flower beds and pots are pink begonias, yellow and orange zinnias, red and white pintas, salvia, hydrangeas, and a pink Indian Hawthorne.

Some autumn ferns are in the bed next to the house as well as asparagus ferns in pots. There are two butterfly bushes, one pink and one purple. Multicolored pansies are in small pots along with pink and red dyanthis, impatiens, and geraniums. Ajuga covers an area by the front porch. An airplane plant, a Boston fern, and a hanging basket of creeping ginny surround the porch.

Please take some time to look at their peaceful, beautiful yard that has graced Blossom.

Crime Watch

Hello, Orchard Hills neighbors and friends! Hope everyone is doing well!

We made it through another Texas summer, and cooler weather is here! At our last crime watch meeting, Officer Sherry addressed several issues we've had in the area, such as jugging, sliding, package thefts, and theft of belongings from unlocked cars. For those unfamiliar with these terms, jugging is the targeting of individuals when they are withdrawing cash from a bank or ATM, and sliding is quickly stealing valuables from unlocked cars, typically at places like gas stations.

To protect yourself, make sure your doors are locked while you are outside your car. With the holidays upon us, be aware of leaving your packages in plain sight in your car. If possible, cover them, or put them in your trunk. Also, be aware of when your packages are delivered at home and get them inside as soon as possible. Be sure to lock your cars and take all valuables out. Make sure all your doors are locked at home as well.


